The Mayor and City Council of the City of Chadron, Nebraska met in regular session in the City Hall Council Chambers at 234 Main Street on the 7th day of June, 2010, at 5:00 o'clock P.M. The following individuals were present: Mayor Donny Grantham, Vice Mayor John Gamby, Councilmembers Rob Harvey, John Chizek and Steve Duncan, City Manager Sandy Powell, City Clerk Donna Rust, City Attorney Adam Edmund, Police Chief Tim Lordino, Public Works Director Milo Rust, and Zoning/Building Official Janet Johnson. Councilmember Harvey introduced the following Resolution and moved for its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-49

WHEREAS, the Olde Main Street Inn, Inc., License #CK19747, 115 Main Street, Chadron, NE, has applied for a Special Designated License from the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission, and the City Council finds that the Special Designated License should be approved as long as said consumption of alcohol is in accordance with and pursuant to licenses granted by the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission, now therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHADRON, NEBRASKA:

1. The City Council being the governing body of the City of Chadron does hereby authorize the consumption of alcoholic liquors by adults between the hours of 8:00 o'clock a.m. and 1:00 o'clock a.m. the following morning on Friday, July 9, 2010 and Saturday, July 10, 2010, in an outdoor area adjacent to the Olde Main Street Inn, which is 95 feet in length and 60 feet in width, located at 115 Main Street, Chadron, Nebraska.

2. It is recommended that approval be granted for a Special Designated License to the Olde Main Street Inn, Inc., 115 Main Street, Chadron, Nebraska, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock a.m. and 1:00 o'clock a.m. the following morning on Friday, July 9, 2010 and Saturday, July 10, 2010, in an outdoor area adjacent to the Olde Main Street Inn, which is 95 feet in length and 60 feet in width, located at 115 Main Street, Chadron, Nebraska, for an outdoor beer garden, pursuant to the rules and regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission and in accordance with any license issued by said Commission.

3. The City Clerk is hereby directed to send a copy of this Resolution by first class mail prepaid to the Nebraska Liquor Commission.

The foregoing Resolution having been read, Councilmember Chizek seconded the motion for its passage and adoption.

City Clerk Rust explained that Jeanne Goetzinger has previously submitted 15 applications for Special Designated Licenses for an outdoor beer garden for the summer months. It was also explained that verbal approval had been received from one of the employees at the Liquor Control Commission, contingent upon Council approval. The applications were approved by the Council on May 17 2010. After submitting the applications, the applicant and City were informed that there was a difference of opinion at the Commission concerning the number of Special Designated Licenses can be issued for one location. Ms. Goetzinger was informed that she has the option to present her request at a hearing before the Commission for additional review. Ms. Goetzinger will be able to submit additional information to support her request for these licenses in writing, in lieu of traveling to Lincoln.

It was clarified that the Liquor Control Commission is saying that a liquor establishment can not have more than 12 SDL's in one calendar year at any one location. They are interpreting 12 SDL's as being 12 days, not 12 separate licenses consisting of 6 days each. Chief Lordino also commented with regard to this agenda item.

Since Ms. Goetzinger's request will be heard next week and she does not want to take a chance of being without an SDL for Fur Trade Days, she has submitted an application for Friday, July 9 and Saturday, July 10, 2010, which is currently before the Council.

After considerable discussion, Councilmember Harvey moved to postpone Resolution No. 2010-49 until the next regular Council Meeting to allow time to hear the outcome of the ruling by the Liquor Control Commission concerning the Special Designated License applications for the Olde Main Street Inn. Seconded by Councilmember Chizek. The following voted Aye: Harvey, Duncan, Grantham, Gamby, Chizek. The following voted Nay: None.

Motion carried.

Councilmember Harvey moved to postpone Resolution No. 2010-50, concerning an application for a Special Designated License for Fur Trade Days, until the next regular Council Meeting to allow for more information from the applicant, Feik's 120. It is recommended that approval be granted for a Special Designated License to Chadron Knights of Columbus Council #1128, Chadron, NE 69337, between the hours of 4:00 o'clock P.M. and 12:00 midnight on Saturday, July 10, 2010, at the Assumption Arena, in an area which is 150' x 100' and located at 355 Spruce St., Chadron, Nebraska, for a wedding dance and reception, pursuant to the rules and regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission and in accordance with any license issued by said Commission.
3. The City Clerk is hereby directed to send a copy of this Resolution by first class mail prepaid to the Nebraska Liquor Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-48

WHEREAS, the Municipal Code of Chadron Nebraska allows the City Council, by resolution, the power to designate certain streets in the City to be truck routes; and

WHEREAS, at this time the Mayor and Council deem it advisable for the safety of motor vehicle and pedestrian traffic that all truck traffic be limited to travel on certain designated routes within the city of Chadron;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHADRON, NEBRASKA:

That there is hereby established a truck route for any commercial vehicles, trucks, truck-tractors and semi-trailers having a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating of 10,000 pounds or more.
The truck route shall be as illustrated in Exhibit A attached.
Resolution 1975-76 relating to truck routes for livestock trucks and all other resolutions in conflict are hereby repealed.

The Council considered a written request from John Coates concerning a revision to Chapter 17 of the Code. Mr. Coates suggested that electric motor boats be allowed at the City reservoir. The Council was of the consensus that this would be agreeable and did not state any objections to allowing electric motor boats at the City reservoir.
